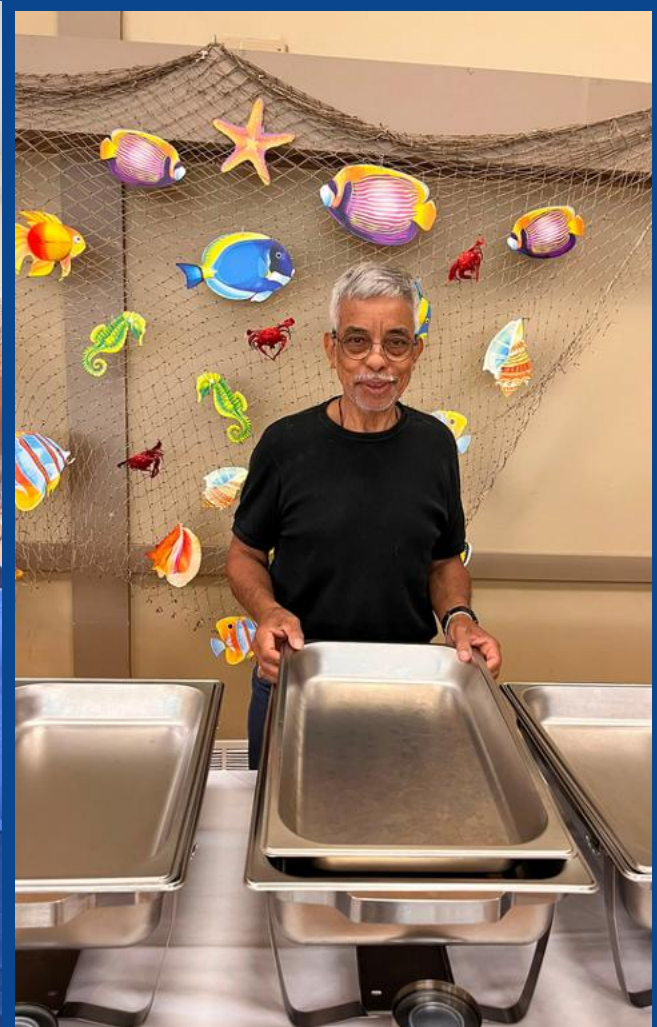

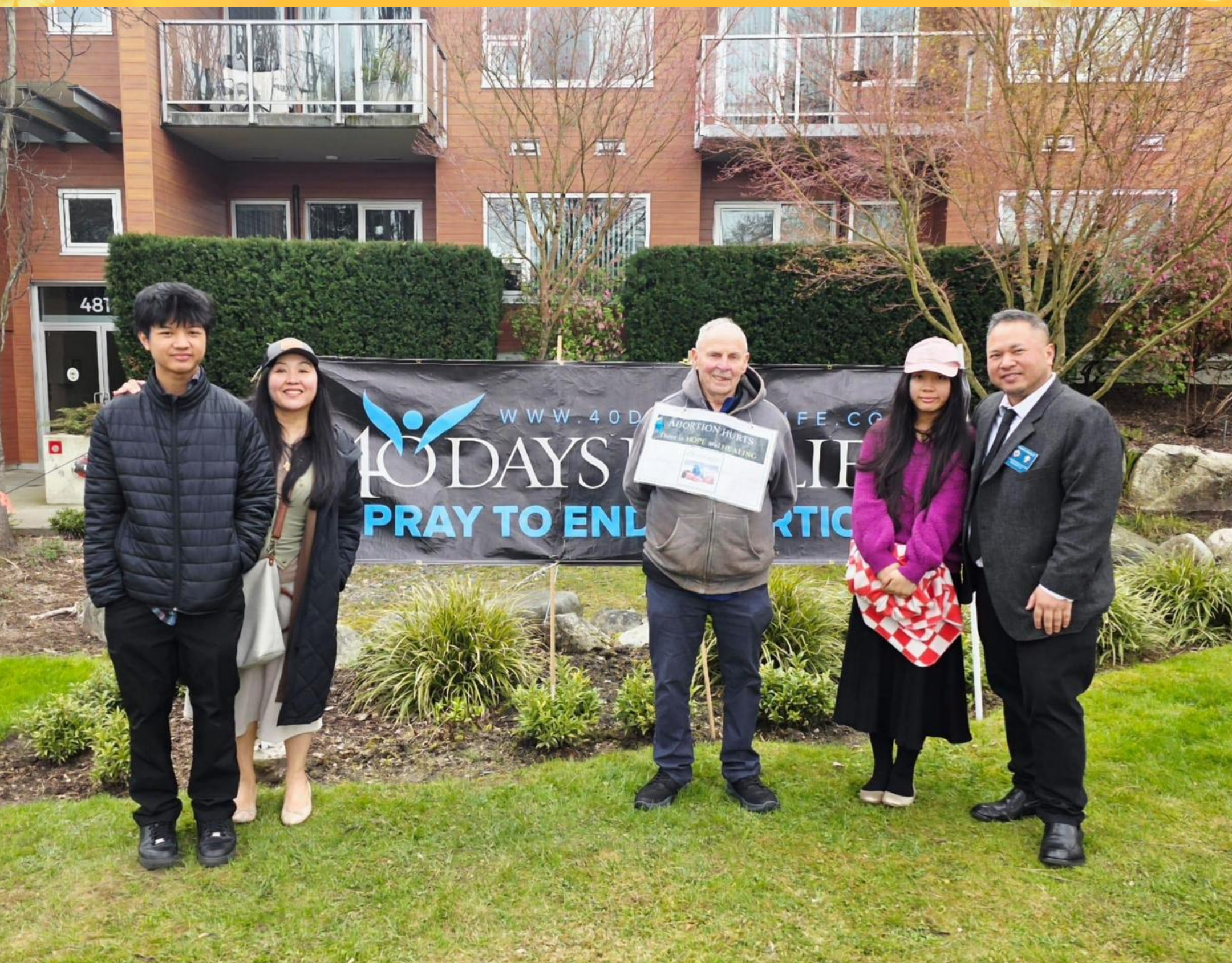

The church will feature a building area of approximately 5,200 square meters and will accommodate up to 540 parishioners.

Our Lady of the Rosary – New Church in Langford

An exciting event will occur this summer when the new Our Lady of the Rosary church is completed at 2936 Irwin Road in Langford and when the building is blessed and the altar consecrated by Bishop Gary Gordon. Langford and the West Shore area is the fastest growing community in the Greater Victoria area. West Shore includes five main municipalities: Langford, Colwood, View Royal, Metchosin, and Highlands.

At the end of February 2026, the lower level of the church hall building was nearly complete and Event Coordinators were being reached out to advise on how to best set-up and manage the spaces for wedding receptions, family reunions, conventions, or other social functions. The Narthex between the church and the hall building has a beautiful high ceiling with exposed wooden roof trusses. The concrete floor of the Nave was finished at the end of February. Roofing work on the church is well underway. Sanctuary windows have been installed. The total building area will be 5,200 square metres, and the church will have a seating capacity of 540.

The parish pastor, Father William Hann, was appointed in July 2024 and has been an enthusiastic leader of fundraising efforts to complete the new church. Ordained on August 15, 2004, he served in several parishes, including St. Joseph the Worker Parish, Holy Cross Parish and Saint Patrick's Parish. He is also Vicar General of the Diocese of Victoria and chair of the Diocese of Victoria Finance Committee. He was a founding member and chair of the Diocesan Health Care Committee. Father William was born on Merasheen Island in Placentia Bay, west of St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador. He considers Victoria to be his second home but his heart is in Champneys' West on the Bonavista Peninsula.
